


Professional Boundaries: A Guideline for Queensland Teachers



Legislation – s9

- (1) A person is eligible for provisional registration if the college is reasonably satisfied
 - (a) either
 - (i) the person has attained the qualifications for provisional registration prescribed under a regulation; OR
 - (ii) the person's education, abilities, experience and contribution to education establish the person meets the requirements under the professional standards for provisional registration; and
 - (b) the person is suitable to teach: and
 - (c) the person meets any other requirements for professional practice for provisional registration prescribed under a regulation.

Professional boundaries

Professional Boundaries: A Guideline for Queensland Teachers

Teachers are responsible for establishing and maintaining appropriate professional boundaries with students. Professional Boundaries: A Guideline for Queensland Teachers is designed to assist teachers. It can help teachers to consider the implications and potential consequences of engaging in certain behaviours with students. It can guide teachers in their response to certain situations to ensure their conduct meets the standard of behaviour expected of teachers in their relationships with students.



Social Media

Lewis Jensen is a Year 6 teacher. Jake is one of his students.

Mr Jensen shares with the class that he likes gaming, and has a Twitch channel.

Jake finds Mr Jensen's Twitch channel and views a live steam. Jake writes a chat message saying 'Hello Sir, its Jake from class'. Mr Jensen gives Jake a shout out during the live stream.

Jake views Mr Jensen's gaming handle, and sends him an invite to join an online game with him, which Mr Jensen does. While playing they engage in generalised voice-to-voice chat.



Social Media - Negative consequences for the student and the student's family

- Potential for oversharing of personal information
- Confusion about the teacher's role
- Student attachment to teacher
- Development of a special relationship
- Behavioural problems
- Peer resentment
- Perception of favouritism



Social Media - Negative consequences for the teacher

- Exposure of personal information
- Relating to a student as a peer instead of as his teacher
- Damage to his reputation and position of authority
- Increased behaviour problems from students
- Breach of employer policy → possible disciplinary action
- Complaint or notification to QCT → possible disciplinary action



Social Media - Negative consequences for the school and teaching profession

- Community and media interest in teacher-student relationships
- Damage to the school's reputation
- Damage to the public's trust in the teaching profession
- Damage to the school morale
- Damage to professional relationships within the school





Social Media

- Social media connection can easily lead to overfamiliarity and possible escalation of inappropriate conduct.
- Teachers should familiarise themselves with their employer's social media policies.
- Any social media communication/interaction with students on an unauthorised platform and/or without a valid context would likely be a breach of professional boundaries.
- The behaviour generally expected of a teacher extends to their private personal digital presence.
- This may extend to former students, even once they become adults.



Relationships with former students


Meg June is a secondary IDT teacher. Harry was a student at the same school, but Miss June was not one of his teachers.

Around the time of Harry's Year 12 graduation, Miss June and Harry became Facebook friends.


After graduating, Miss June and Harry exchanged Snapchat details and began chatting while Harry is at Schoolies. After Schoolies they began seeing each other.

A couple of months later they entered into a sexual relationship.





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QCAT disciplinary outcome

- Miss June's teacher registration was cancelled.
- Miss June was prohibited from reapplying for teacher registration for four years.
- Any application for re-registration must be accompanied by a detailed and independent psychologist's report.

QCAT findings

Queensland College of Teachers v Teacher XBW [2019] QCAT 240

'By virtue of a teacher's position...disparities in age, maturity and life experience, and the inherent vulnerability of young people, there is a power imbalance between teachers and students which must not be exploited. In respect of former students, this power imbalance continues after the student finishes school. It takes time to dissipate.'

Queensland College of Teachers v PPK [2019] QCAT 59

'...the differences in power and authority which exist create an imbalance between the teacher and student which can continue even after the teacher or student leaves the school. The imbalance can last for some time and is not generally something that can be immediately extinguished at a particular point in time.'



Allegations involving former students

- Intimate/sexual relationships with former students will always be considered by PCU.
- There is no prescribed time period that allows for relationships with former students.



Conduct involving former students

Factors taken into account when considering the conduct include, but are not limited to:

- years since former student left school
- age difference between former student and teacher
- nature of the teacher/student relationship when at school
- vulnerability of the former student
- emotional/social maturity of the former student
- contact/communication between teacher and former student since leaving school







Applying for registration

To teach in a Queensland school you must be approved to teach.

To qualify for registration you need to meet the eligibility requirements or hold current teacher registration in another Australian state or territory, or New Zealand (mutual recognition).

(School-based, employment-based, or alternative certification routes into teaching do not meet the qualification requirement for teacher registration in Queensland, in these circumstances please contact the QCT before applying.)


