

FAQs Graduate Certificate in Higher Education

□ What is the Grad Cert in Higher Education?

- an accredited, UQ program
- integrates scholarship with skill for teaching in higher education
- explores innovative teaching and learning practices
- seeks to directly improve higher education teaching and course design
- based on adult learning principles and interactive in design

□ Who is it for?

- academic staff in higher education, at all levels of experience
- research higher degree candidates
- technical and further education, and industry trainers

We recommend:

- new teaching staff undertake the program soon after appointment.
- international staff and students check visa eligibility with UQ International.
- research higher degree candidates consult their research advisory team before applying to enrol in the program.

NB: RHD candidates must submit an Application for Concurrent Enrolment form to the Graduate School.

□ What are the outcomes?

- develop yourself as an educator
- improve the way your students learn
- enrich teaching performance and course design
- interact with innovative educational designs
- work collaboratively with a diverse colleagues



□ How is the program structured?

- consists of four 2-unit courses
- usually taken part-time over two years
- blended format: face-to-face and online
- new cohort intake at semester 1 (in EDUC6100)
- the other courses are prerequisites for EDUC6103
- EDUC6103 has a project component

❑ Should I enrol in 1 or 2 courses per semester?

- most people take the program over two years
- you may be able to complete the program in one year (see commitment guide below)
- discuss this with colleagues who have recently completed the program

Commitment Guide

- EDUC6100 begins with a full Saturday class just prior to start of semester 1
- subsequent classes for each course are fortnightly
- an online learning module is completed in the weeks between classes
- class time is 3 hrs per fortnight for each course
- learning modules take about 3-4 hours per fortnight for each course
- there are typically two assignments for each course
